Mobility in Prague - 22-26 November 2021

The highlight of November was without a doubt the reunion in Prague after such a long pandemic. Until the last few minutes, all the students in their countries were anxious and feared that we would not be able to carry out the mobility. This made the meeting more emotional on site.

The week started with an extremely warm welcome by the mayor Renáta Zajíčková and Jana Korecká, coordinator school of the largest district of Prague, Praha 5 (about 82 000 inhabitants). It was emphasised how important it is that such projects take place in order to promote a Europe of togetherness and tolerance and to foster understanding for different cultures. On the other hand, references were made to the Erasmus+ programme. It is a great project, especially in times of the pandemic, to exchange digital apps and teaching methods across Europe.





One of the important focal points of this mobility was the work on <u>STEM subjects</u>. On the first day pupils and teachers took part in various virtual technology workshops at the secondary school



"Technical School in Prague 5", namely: Robotics, 3D Technology and IoT, where we experienced which teaching contents are learned at the school experimentally and practically. We were not only surprised by the excellent equipment of the school, but also very impressed by the digital-technical teaching possibilities this school offers in the Czech upper grades.

We continued with the development of the 2nd station of our ebook on <u>"Cultural Heritage"</u>, which will be continued in the coming months. All the national student groups had their say and described the different stations, which were then visited first-hand.



From the pompous and magnificent St. Nicholas Church, to the seat of government of the President of the Republic including its breathtaking view of the city, to the Charles Bridge, all these significant places offered an impressive picture of beautiful Prague. The cultural heritage of the city has not yet been fully explored, but we are on a very good way to take another important step towards it during this intercultural exchange.
